Jill Brenner, ranked second in the state in the girls 14-and-under division. "They're yelling (at their kids) all the time."

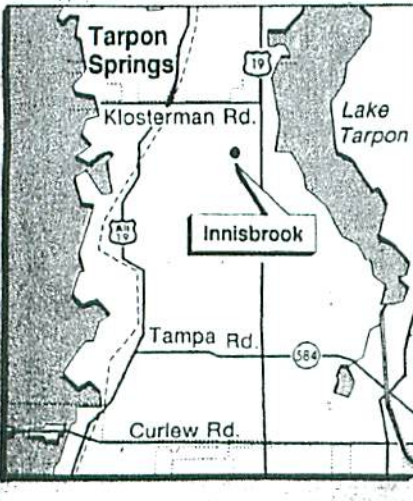
The worst incident Brenner said she witnessed was last year at Miami's the Easter Bowl tournament.

State's best tee it up this week in Florida Open at Innisbrook

Florida Open begins this week

The 47th annual Florida Open will be held at the Innisbrook Resort in Tarpon Springs for the fourth consecutive year. Open activities begin today on the Copperhead course with an amateur scramble at 11 a.m., followed by a professional shootout at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday's pro-am is also on the Copperhead. The actual tournament begins Thursday at 8 a.m. with the first round and Friday's second round on both the Copperhead and Island courses. The final two rounds Saturday and Sunday are on the Island Course only. The total purse is more than \$50,000 with the winner receiving more than \$8,000. The tournament will feature several of the state's best pros, including PGA Tour player John Huston of Palm Harbor, the 1985 champion. Admission is \$5. The Innisbrook Resort is located on the west side of U.S. 19, between the intersections of Alderman and Klosterman roads.

TARPON SPRINGS — Florida's best golfers, all but one of the PGA Tour players, congregate this week for the Florida Open at the Innisbrook Resort.

The four-day, 72-hole event begins Thursday. Pre-tournament competitions start today and include the Pro Shootout at 5:30 p.m. on the Copperhead course. The shootout, similar to shootouts preceding PGA and LPGA events, features some of the tournament's top-ranked players, teamed up and teeing off in sudden-death play.

The Florida Open, which began in 1942, has become more exclusive in recent years and, in 1985, qualifying tournaments were started to pare the field. This year, more than 500 golfers attempted to gain entry, with 180 making it. They will play for over \$50,000 in prize money, including over \$8,000 for the winner.

Defending champion Bruce Fleisher, 39, of Miami, has returned and seeks to become only the third player to win the Open more than twice (Don Bisplinghoff won in 1955-56 and '61-62; Pete Cooper won eight times, between 1944 and '66).

Fleisher, who won his first Open in 1980, shot a 66 on the final round last year to win by five strokes with a 10-under 277. Par is an odd-numbered 287 because one round is played on the par-71 Copperhead and three rounds, including the last two, are on the par-72 Island course.

The most obvious challenger to Fleisher is John Huston of Palm Harbor. A Florida Open winner in 1985, Huston qualified for the PGA Tour last year and is currently ranked 65th on the money list with \$113,164 in earnings.

Huston represents Innisbrook on the Tour, as does Bill Buttner of Gulfport. Buttner, however, won't be here this week. In danger of losing his Tour card, Buttner will try to get collect some PGA cash at the Buick Open in Michigan.

Clearwater's Greg Kraft, who finished tied for second last year, will return. Kraft, like many of the pros at Innisbrook this week, plays on the mini-tours (golf's version of the minor leagues to the PGA Tour), waiting for his next chance at the PGA qualifying tournament.
